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How Long Is Each Class?

From start to finish, each class is 35 minutes long. If you have a late start or did not finish your activity, you may extend your class time at your discretion as long as you are not disrupting the preschool's other activities or late for another class.

Where Do I Go When I Arrive At A Location?

This varies based on each location. At most locations, you will set up your dance space, in your designated dance area appointed by the preschool, and then go to each classroom to sign your students out of class.

What Do I Do If I Receive A Payment At A Location?

Almost all of our families pay through our auto-debit plan but some families, such as our YMCA and Deane Hill families, will pay either online or through cash/check at a preschool. Checks are to be made out to TwinkleToes and if you receive a payment, please notify us of the payment and we can make arrangements to collect it from you.

Can I Change Lesson Plans/Curriculum?
